Course Description

This Symposium provides the most recent treatment strategies and interventions for stroke and brain injury patients across the continuum of care. This unique lecture series offers insight into a wide variety of topics rarely covered by most continuing education courses. Speakers include nationally and locally recognized health care providers, specializing in the management and rehabilitation of stroke and brain injury. Following the symposium, participants will have the opportunity to attend the MedStar National Rehabilitation Network's Stroke and Brain Injury Open House and Education Fair where they will be able to interact with community and therapy vendors. Clinicians and allied health care providers who treat patients with neurological deficits are encouraged to attend.

Course Objectives

- Identify the most common and significant types of vision loss after stroke or brain injury and their impact on function and rehabilitation.
- Understand how to apply vision rehabilitation strategies to specific individualized treatment sessions for PT, OT, SLP, and other healthcare providers.
- Understand the current definition, prevalence, and pathophysiology of concussion and post concussion syndrome and how this impacts rehabilitation for PT, OT, SLP and other health care providers.
- Understand the roles of the concussion rehabilitation interdisciplinary team, including PT, OT, SLP, and other health care providers.
- Gain an understanding of when a patient should be referred to different specialists for management of concussion.
- Recognize the different ways people with aphasia describe their inner speech and how it impacts the treatment interventions of PT, OT, SLP, and other health care providers .
- Learn about the recent evidence on how self reported inner speech relates to behavior and how this can impact treatment strategies for PT, OT, SLP and other health care providers.
- Demonstrate increased comfort while educating clients on sex and intimacy concerns.
- Increase knowledge on how to treat and provide intervention for a variety of sex and intimacy concerns.
- Review impaired self awareness (ISA) following TBI and the impact on therapeutic interventions and recovery for PT, OT, SLP, and other health care providers.
- Discuss rehabilitation strategies for treating impaired self awareness (ISA) following TBI.
